NANCY LARRICK

Nancy Larrick was born on December 28, 1910, in Winchester, Virginia to Herbert S. and Nancy Nulton Larrick. She married Alexander L. Crosby on February 15, 1958.

She is best known as a writer for children who, as a lover of poetry, has shared her delight with children everywhere. Her <u>Parents Guide to Children's Reading</u> has also been very influential and she has an impressive array of other achievements.

After graduating from Goucher College in 1930, Nancy taught in the public schools of Winchester, Virginia for the next twelve years, establishing herself as a respected educator. She completed her M.A. degree at Columbia in 1936, and her Ed.D. from New York University in 1955. During this time she also served as the Education Director for Children's Books at Random House Inc. in New York City. Since about 1960, she has also been a freelance writer.

She held teaching posts during other periods at New York University Graduate School of Education, Indiana University, and the Bank Street College of Education. She was a visiting professor at Lehigh University and lectured at the University of Chicago, University of Montana, University of Texas, and other universities in the East.

Through the years she has been active in the International Reading Association, serving as its president during 1956-57. She has also been active in the National Council of Teachers of English and in the National Conference on Research in English.

She received the New York University Founder's Day Achievement Awards in 1955, the Edison Foundation and the Carey-Thomas Awards in 1959, the International Reading Association Certificate of Merit, the Drexel University certificate for contributions to Children's Literature, and was named to the Reading Hall of Fame in 1977 and was given the Recipient Award for Contributions to Literacy by Indiana University in 1982.
