She always enjoyed teaching students one-on-one and developing strategies for struggling readers. She adored her long-time friends and loved to make new friends and mentor young people. She delighted in the arts, attending operas at the Met and dance at the Joyce Theater. She enjoyed mindfulness meditation and quiet time in nature. She is survived by her sister and brother-in-law, Cary and Gary Hart, her nieces Elissa, Katherine and Laura and their families and many devoted extended family members, friends and students. Her generous spirit and zest for life will be sorely missed.
